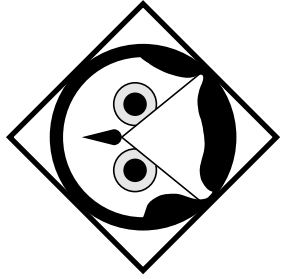
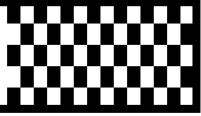


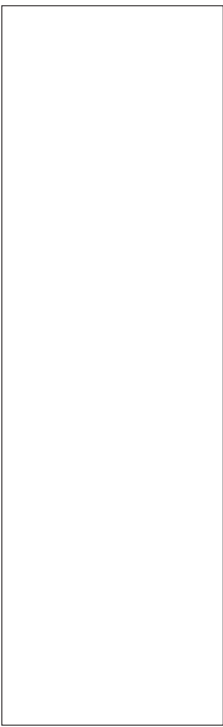

AWSC Director's Report March 2007

President Report: How do the clubs feel about a different "Host Agency", other than the DNR?? The DNR does not support the AWSC. AWSC is thinking about the Tourism Dept. I need input from the club on how to vote on this matter???

The present officers were elected for another year term. Sam Landes as Executive Director for another year.

Liberty Insurance has paid out \$150,000 in Accidental Death claims in the past 10 years.

Legislative: Would like to keep 55 m.p.h. speed limit in affect. Deer Hunt will be in affect this coming December 2007 again. 18,000 deer were killed. 2,800 above Hwy 8 in Dec. 2006 hunt.

Magazine: Postal rates are going up. Could affect AWSC cost of mailing magazines to members.

Membership: As of March 16, 2007 there are 24,039 members in AWSC.

Safety/Education: We are looking to update the student manuals and get some NEW Instructor aid to help us teach our classes. I NEED ALL SAFETY INSTRUCTORS TO MAKE CHANGES IN THE STUDENT BOOK AND GET CHANGES TO ME BY THE JULY CLUB MEETING. We have been complaining about this for a long time. We now have the chance to make changes. PLEASE

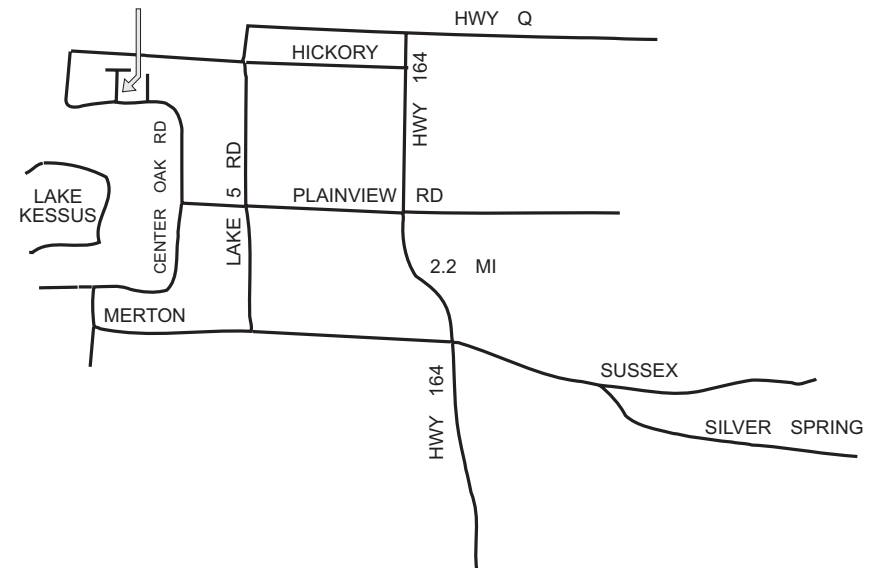

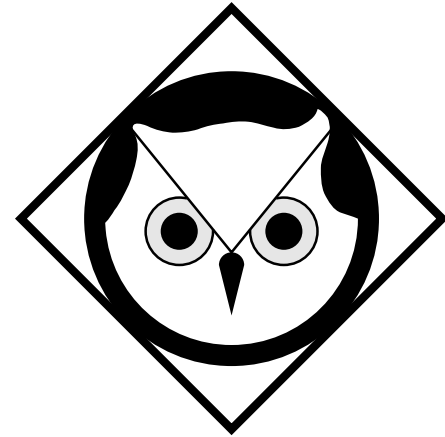
