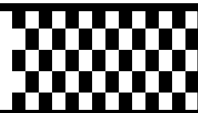


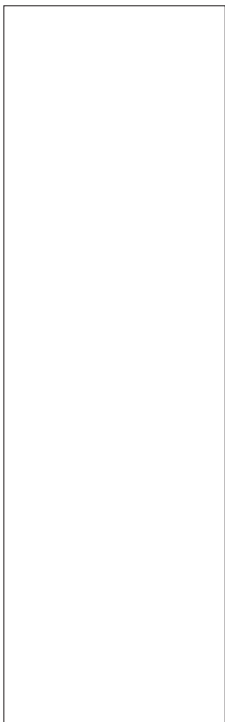

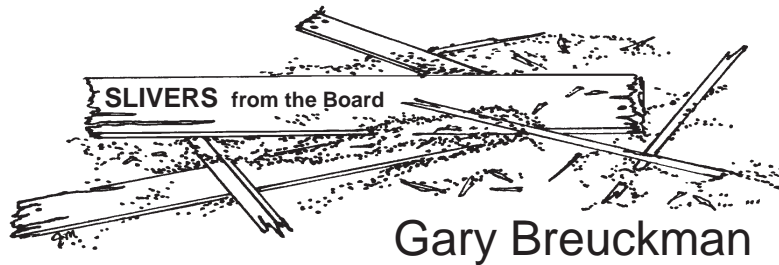

I hope everyone was happy with the choice for the Christmas Party and dinner this year. As you've heard, our previous location, the Richfield Chalet, is not in operation right now. The Board did an extensive search to find a location that was reasonably priced and family friendly, and I think we did just fine. Scott Makowski did most of the work arranging the dinner and collecting the reservations, so a big *thank you* to Scott for doing this.

We appreciate everyone's co-operation with sending in their reservation and then showing up - it's really hard sometimes to have an accurate count for events like this. Adding additional numbers to the count so unexpected guests don't go hungry costs us money, so we don't want to do that if we can get those reservations in.

We had a squadron of elves this year to hand out gifts to the youngsters as Santa was unavailable this year - see cover photo - that went well with all the recipients, I think.

We awarded two 40-year membership certificates this year, and one lifetime membership to Scott & Bev Makowski for 35 years of membership. This will be the last lifetime membership for a while, there can't be another for six years.

Our first safety school session in Nov/Dec had 20 students, and we have about 27 in the January class. I say "about" because some of the forms went home for signatures so I don't have them all yet. Dick Brunow has headed up the raffle wheel for years now, and he would like someone to take over as the lead person for that area. Dick told me that he has purchased the majority of the prizes for this year already, so he's looking for someone willing to take charge after this year's dinner.

There is shopping for the prizes for the next year, but it's all on your schedule, there's no urgency except for the final deadline. And then, of course, running the wheel that night and producing an accounting of games played and profits afterwards. If you are interested in doing this, please talk to any Officer or Board member.

Now is a good time to be thinking ahead to next summer's events. Is there something you would like to arrange, or run, or at least suggest? Getting something on the schedule early is a great idea, so that no one plans something personal on the same date and then can't attend.
